BYLAW NO. 06-2017

A BYLAW TO AMEND BYLAW NO. 01-2016 KNOWN AS
THE UTILITY SERVICE MANAGEMENT BYLAW

The Council of the Town of Wolseley, in the Province of Saskatchewan, enacts to amend Bylaw No. 01-2016 as follows:

1. That Sub-subsection [3(3.1)(l)] which states “ *Sewer Job*” means the act of the Public Works Department performing a clean-out of a sewer service line that has become obstructed due to tree roots, or by other means of blockage, at the request of the Consumer, at a charge set by a resolution Council.” be amended to state, “ **Sewer Job**” means the act of a Contractor performing a clean-out of a sewer service line that has become obstructed due to tree roots, or by other means of blockage, at the request of the Consumer.”
2. That Sub-section [6(6.6)] which states “*The cost of Sewer Job(s) from the main to the premises shall be borne by the Property Owner. Associated costs shall be set by a resolution of Council.*” be amended to state, “**The cost of Sewer Job(s) from the main to the premises shall be borne by the Property Owner. The Property Owner must provide Proof of Blockage (i.e. Invoice for service) to the Administrator for a credit to be applied to the respective Utility Account where the Sewer Job was performed. The credit shall be determined in accordance with Policy set by resolution of Council.**”
3. That Sub-section [7(7.4)] which states “*There shall be a \$200.00 charge, in addition to full payment of utilities accounts, for turning water on where the service had been terminated due to nonpayment of accounts.*” be amended to state, “**There shall be a \$50.00 charge, in addition to full payment of the utility account, for turning water back on where the service had been terminated due to nonpayment of account.**”
4. This bylaw shall come into force and take effect when adopted by Council.
